



YOUR CHILD NEEDS

- A face mask
- A face shield is optional for Year 1 & 2
- A lunch bag (all items in lunchbox will be sent home)
- Closed shoes/ trainers with socks

2 DON'T SEND

- · A school bag
- Unnecessary items
- · Show and tell items
- Recycling

3 UNIFORM

You will need to wash your child's uniform after every use. If you do not have the correct uniform on alternate days we will understand. We do, however, ask that your child be neat and that a close approximation item be substituted.

HEALTH & SAFETY

Morning routine:

An adult will take your child's temperature while they are in the car. If your child has a high temperature or are ill they will need to return home.

Walk to the front door and stand in a foot sanitation area.

Then walk into the school to have hands sanitised.

To show the correct amount of social distancing, tape has been placed on the floor. Children will then walk directly to their class.

Afternoon routine:

One class will sit to each side of the veranda. Marks have been painted on the veranda to show children where to sit. It is very important that you wait for your child in your car.

Classroom routine:

Each class has a hand sanitiser. Before children enter the class they will sanitise their hands and then regularly throughout the day on a schedule. The sanitiser will be administered by the teacher.

Bathroom breaks will be scheduled per class and with teacher supervision to avoid congestion and ensure social distancing in this area.

CLASSROOM ENVIRONMENT

As a basic principle we will be working in pods across the classes. This means that each child has their own stationery and self contained box of toys, games and equipment that they will use through the course of the day. At the end of the day their box of items will be sanitised.

We will endeavour to become as paperless as possible. We will not be using books in the classrooms but rather pieces of paper. Once work is completed it will be uploaded onto Seesaw and the paper recycled.

There will be a record of what children have completed in the class the previous day, which may be helpful for their home learning activities too. If any art is completed in a day it will be sent directly home.

Reading books will continue to be read on Seesaw as we are trying to minimise any unnecessary items moving between school and home.

BREAK TIMES

- Each year group will have their own break time.
- After each break time the playground will be sprayed down with disinfectant.
- There will be a maximum of 20 children in the playground at any one time.
- 4 teachers will be on duty per break time allowing an allocation of 5 children to each adult.
- Limited equipment will be taken out each break and sanitised after use.
- Each year group has a different format for break time.
- In Nursery and Reception the playground will be divided into 4 quadrants. The children are in groups of 4/5 with their adult and will rotate around the quadrants. Different activities in each quadrant and games ensuring social distancing will be in place.
- In Year 1 and Year 2 the playground will be divided into 4 quadrants and each teacher will monitor their quadrant ensuring that proper social distancing is in place.



What will happen if I choose not to send my child back to school?

Your child will then receive a video of the teaching that has taken place the previous day along with any of the learning engagements which the children in class completed. These will be uploaded onto Seesaw and the teacher will be able to see how your child is engaging and scaffold work accordingly. On the alternate day they will continue with the home learning programme.



Please do not exit your vehicle or come into the school unless absolutely necessary. This will help us to keep the school environment and the people in the school environment as safe as possible.
