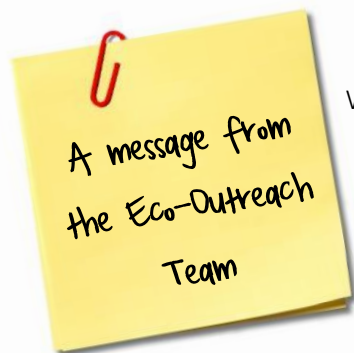

Relationships & Sex Education Week (KS2) 19th July

Your child's health and wellbeing are important to us. As part of our PSHE and Science curriculum at ISCT, all our children will be participating in a programme called Relationships and Sex Education, which will run from 19 to 23 July. Our programme is based on UK National Curriculum guidance. Each year group will run specific sessions that have strict boundaries. A session will be held at the end of the week in each year group to answer written questions only. Questions will not be taken during the delivery of the sessions as we feel it is very important for us to be able to prepare our responses age appropriately. We believe that it is easier to learn about these sensitive issues in secure conditions, in familiar surroundings, with well-known friends, and with well-known adults. During this particular week we would like to provide our children with accurate information and communication skills to help them make decisions that can keep them healthy and safe, with a good understanding of themselves and how they can form healthy relationships with each other.

Parents, guardians and schools share a common goal: We want students of all ages to be **healthy in every aspect of their lives.**

We know that our children and their families have a range of beliefs, cultures and values. **Those family values are the core, essential guidelines for your child's life.** For this reason we will be delivering this programme without any of our own beliefs, opinions or views.

We encourage parents to extend our topics and discussions at home with your own personal values, allowing your children to feel free and comfortable to ask questions.

COMING SOON



In **August**, we'll be holding an **online market** for our budding KS2 entrepreneurs.

In the past, this has been a one-day event held at school, with stalls set up in the KS2 area for staff, students and parents to browse and purchase.

This year, we'll be taking the market online – no queues, no cash.

If your child would like to make and sell their wares, this is what you'll need to do:

- ✓ Help your child to decide and plan what they're able to make and sell.
- ✓ Use the school holidays to practise, prepare and take photos.
- ✓ Price up your materials and ingredients.
- ✓ Discuss budget, expenses and profit with your child.
- ✓ Read up and set up SnapScan – you'll need to share your QR code for parents to transfer money electronically when they place their orders.
- ✓ First week of Term 3 (Tuesday 13 July) – send photos, QR code and description of items to Mrs Neethling.
- ✓ **13 July – 13 August:** Promote and advertise your products with posters, leaflets, flyers or business cards (max A4 size – check with Mrs Neethling for permission)
- ✓ Pre-orders for ISCT shoppers: 2-6 August
- ✓ Track payments from shoppers via SnapScan.
- ✓ Prepare the orders (after payment has been received). Your child will deliver the orders to the shoppers when the order has been completed.

What you need to know:

- Homemade/handmade items only
- Individual items priced at R20 or less
- Children may work together in pairs or small teams (ISCT KS2 only)
- Planning, making and selling will happen at home
- No cash will be exchanged at school – cashless payments through SnapScan
- **Consider COVID safety guidelines while making, packing and delivering.**

It is up to parents to read the SnapScan Terms & Conditions and determine whether you can/would like to operate through SnapScan. If you don't feel comfortable with this, please don't sign your child up for the KS2 Market.

Please note that money transferred through SnapScan can only be used in SnapScan. It cannot be exchanged for cash or moved electronically into a bank account.
